



## DIRECTORS APPROVAL – OR102/09/02

### TREATMENT AND ERADICATION OF BANANA DISEASES AND PESTS WITHIN THE NSW BANANA PROTECTED AREA IN ACCORDANCE WITH ORDER OR102

I, Ian Roth, Acting Director, Animal and Plant Biosecurity of New South Wales Department of Primary Industries, pursuant to Order OR102, section 3 (c) published in the *Government Gazette* No. 21 of 23 January 2009 on pages 461 to 464, approve of the following condition of movement of *Musaceae* planting material within the NSW Banana Protected Area:-

1. Cavendish and other Panama disease resistant *Musaceae* cultivar planting material is allowed to be moved from land within the NSW Banana Protected Area that is known to be infested with Panama disease (*Fusarium oxysporum* f. sp. *cubense*) to banana plantations within the local government areas of Byron Bay and Tweed only, provided the planting material is sourced from 1000 metres or more from a *Musaceae* plant known to be infected with Bunchy Top Virus (BBTV) and the planting material is to be planted on land known to be infested with Panama disease.

**Note:**

*The movement of Musaceae planting material referred to in this approval must be in accordance with a permit issued by an inspector authorised to do so under the Plant Diseases Act 1924 No. 38 and in accordance with Order OR102.*
