Normally each property has its own PIC. However, one PIC can be used for more than one property provided the properties are used for a common purpose (eg to graze the same livestock) and are proximate (adjoining or nearby). If you wish to apply for a PIC to cover more than one property, please complete a separate form with the property and owner details for each property and submit all forms together.
