STOCK DISEASES ACT 1923

Section 13

Notification No. 1548

Notification requiring owners of land, and lessees of Crown land, to fence land

I, RICHARD AMERY, M.P., Minister for Agriculture, pursuant to section 13 of the Stock Diseases Act 1923, require all owners of land, and all lessees of Crown land, within all quarantine areas, declared pursuant to section 8 or section 10 of the Stock Diseases Act 1923, or deemed pursuant to section 11 of the Stock Diseases Act 1923, which are quarantine areas on account of cattle tick infestation due to *Boophilus microplus*, to fence the land within 30 days from the date upon which:

- (a) this notification is published in the *NSW Government Gazette* for all land which has been declared or deemed to be a quarantine area before the date upon which this notification is published; or
- (b) the land is declared or deemed to be a quarantine area for all land which is to be declared or deemed to be a quarantine area on or after the date upon which this notification is published in the *NSW Government Gazette*,

to prevent any stock described below from getting into or getting out of the land.

"Stock" means cattle, deer, goats, horses, sheep, camels, buffalo and alpacas.

PLANT DISEASES ACT 1924

PROCLAMATION [P85]

PROCLAMATION to prohibit the importation, introduction and bringing into specified portions of New South Wales of certain fruit originating from or which has moved through other specified portions of New South Wales on account of a third outbreak so far this calendar year of Queensland fruit fly at Hillston.

G SAMUELS, A.C., Governor

I, the Hon GORDON SAMUELS AC, Governor of the State of New South Wales, with the advice of the Executive Council and:

- A. pursuant to section 4 (1) of the Plant Diseases Act 1924 and being of the opinion that any host fruit from the outbreak area is likely to introduce the pest Queensland fruit fly (*Bactrocera tryoni*) into the suspension area and that any host fruit from the outbreak area or suspension area is likely to introduce the pest Queensland fruit fly into the outer area, prohibit the following, subject to paragraph B:
 - (i) the importation, introduction or bringing into the suspension area of any host fruit

originating from or which has moved through the outbreak area;

- (ii) the importation, introduction or bringing into the outer area of any host fruit originating from or which has moved through the outbreak area or suspension area.

B. Paragraph A does not apply to host fruit that is transported in a manner to prevent or otherwise control infestation with Queensland fruit fly and satisfies at least one of the following conditions:

- (i) the host fruit is accompanied by a Plant Health Certificate issued by an inspector, certifying that the host fruit has been treated in a manner approved by the Chief, Division of Plant Industries;
- (ii) the host fruit is moved in accordance with the written consent of the Chief, Division of Plant Industries.

Definitions

In this Proclamation:

fruit means the edible part of a plant derived from a flower;

host fruit means fruit specified in Schedule 3;

inspector means an inspector appointed under the Act;

outbreak area means that portion of New South Wales specified in Schedule 1;

outer area means that portion of New South Wales known as the New South Wales Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone, as declared in the Notification published in *Government Gazette* No. 68 of 13 May 1994, other than the outbreak area and suspension area;

suspension area means that portion of New South Wales specified in Schedule 2.

SCHEDULE 1

The portion of New South Wales within a 1.5 kilometre radius of the point situated at Hillston at co-ordinates 33.24.69 and 145.40.05.

SCHEDULE 2

The portion of New South Wales within a 15 kilometre radius of the point situated at Hillston at co-ordinates 33.24.69 and 145.40.05, other than the outbreak area.

SCHEDULE 3

All citrus fruit, pome fruit, stone fruit and tropical fruit.

The following berry fruit:

The following other fruit:
