



## Application and authority for a registered veterinary practitioner to administer ProteqFlu and ProteqFlu TE vaccine in NSW

Persons who use equine influenza vaccine on horses not destined for export must first be authorised in writing by the Chief Veterinary Officer (CVO) in accordance with a Control Order under section 22 of the Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1991.

### APPLICATION

**A. Declaration by a veterinary practitioner** (please print legibly)

I, ....., a veterinary practitioner registered in New South Wales, hereby undertake to vaccinate horses against equine influenza using ProteqFlu and ProteqFlu TE vaccine. I understand that the vaccine is a genetically modified organism and I agree to:

- complete vaccination training that is approved by the CVO,
- implement biosecurity measures when entering and leaving properties with horses in accordance with legislative requirements under the Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1991,
- make and manage all written records pertaining to vaccination as directed by the CVO,
- abide by all legal requirements relating to the handling and administration of the vaccine, record-keeping and identification of vaccinates,
- forward reports of significant or serious adverse reactions to NSW DPI as directed by the CVO,
- abide by any other conditions imposed by the CVO in relation to handling and administration of the vaccine, record-keeping and identification of vaccinates.

I understand that failure to comply with any of the above requirements, conditions and undertakings renders this authorisation invalid.

1. This authority can be revoked at any time by the CVO without the provision of reasons to the veterinary practitioner.
2. This authority only relates to the administration of ProteqFlu and ProteqFlu TE for equine influenza control and eradication purposes as directed by the CVO.
3. Horses means horses, mules, donkeys and other animals in the Equidae family.
4. CVO means the Chief Veterinary Officer of NSW, or a Deputy Chief Veterinary Officer of NSW.
5. NSW DPI means the NSW Department of Primary Industries.
