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# NOMINATION OF KEY THREATENING PROCESSES

Sections of the *Fisheries Management Act 1994* (as amended in 2006), relating to threatened species conservation, and additional information required for the nomination of a key threatening process.

## A: FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

“**Threatening process**” means a process that threatens, or that may threaten, the survival or evolutionary development of species, populations or ecological communities of fish or marine vegetation.

### SECTION 220 F (6) Key threatening processes

A threatening process is eligible to be listed as a key threatening process if it:

- a) adversely affects 2 or more threatened species, populations or ecological communities, or
- b) could cause species, populations or ecological communities that are not threatened to become threatened.

### SECTION 220 I Making a nomination for inclusion in or omission from threatened species lists

Any person may nominate an amendment to Schedules 4, 5 or 6.

**It is an OFFENCE to make a vexatious nomination.**

## B: ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

A nomination of a key threatening process for listing in Schedule 6 of the *Fisheries Management Act 1994* must include the following information:

- a) a description of the threatening process that is sufficient to distinguish it from any other threatening process by reference to its biological components and its non-biological components, and the interactions of those components, that are known to the person or persons making the nomination;
- b) any listed species, populations or ecological communities adversely affected by the threatening process;
- c) any species, populations or ecological communities not currently listed that could become threatened because of the threatening process;
- d) the reasons why the preparation of a threat abatement plan is considered to be an effective and efficient means of abating the threatening process by the person or persons making the nomination;
- e) in cases of a de-listing, the reasons why the key threatening process is no longer in effect within the meaning of the Act; and
- f) references to any scientific literature or other published information that supports the information provided in the nomination.
