#### GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**Timber** - another name for wood

**Habitat** - the place where a plant or animal usually lives

**Fungi** - mushrooms are a type of fungi

**Gem** - a precious stone

**Resin** - gum from plants

**Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Officer** - an Aboriginal person who searches for special Aboriginal places in the forest

**Ecologist** - a scientist who studies plants and animals

**Forester** - a scientist who studies the way forests are used and how they grow

**Ranger** - forest workers who look after picnic and camping areas and chat to forest visitors

**State forest** - forests for human use and native plant and animal conservation
