

PLANT DISEASES ACT 1924

PROCLAMATION P191

PROCLAMATION to regulate the importation, introduction and bringing into specified part of New South Wales, known as the Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area, of certain fruit and packaging on account of the pest Queensland fruit fly (*Bactrocera tryoni*).

I, Professor MARIE BASHIR, AC, CVO, Governor of the State of New South Wales, with the advice of the Executive Council:

1. Pursuant to section 3 (2) of the Plant Diseases Act 1924, hereby revoke Proclamation P183 published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette* No. 33 of 14 March 2008, at pages 2269 to 2270 and any proclamation revived as a result of these revocations;
2. Pursuant to section 4 (1) of the Plant Diseases Act 1924, being of the opinion that the importation, introduction or bringing in of certain fruit and packaging into the specified portion of the State, known as the Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area, is likely to introduce the pest Queensland fruit fly (*Bactrocera tryoni*), do by this Proclamation regulate the importation, introduction or bringing into the Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area in the manner set out in this Proclamation.
 - A. The specified portion of New South Wales to which this Proclamation applies is to be known as the Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area, and is as described in Schedule 2 below;
 - B. Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited, unless the Queensland fruit fly host produce, as listed in Schedule 1, is imported, introduced or brought into the Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area:
 - i. in accordance with written conditions of movement, as approved from time to time by the Deputy Director-General, Division of Agriculture, Biosecurity and Mine Safety, Director, the Director, Animal and Plant Biosecurity, the Director, Compliance Operations, or the Director, Compliance Standards; or
 - ii. with the specific written approval of the Deputy Director-General, Division of Agriculture, Biosecurity and Mine Safety, Director, the Director, Animal and Plant Biosecurity, the Director, Compliance Operations, or the Director, Compliance Standards, and in compliance with any conditions specified in that approval.
 - C. Used packaging which has contained fruit susceptible to Queensland fruit fly, is allowed entry provided it is imported, introduced or brought into the Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area in a manner approved from time to time by the Deputy Director-General, Division of Agriculture, Biosecurity and Mine Safety, Director, the Director, Animal and Plant Biosecurity, the Director, Compliance Operations, or the Director, Compliance Standards, and in compliance with any conditions specified in that approval.

Definitions

In this Proclamation:

Director-General, Agriculture, Biosecurity and Mine Safety means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Deputy-Director, Agriculture, Biosecurity and Mine Safety of NSW Department of Primary Industries.

Director, Animal and Plant Biosecurity means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position the Director, Animal and Plant Biosecurity of NSW Department of Primary Industries.

Director, Compliance Operations means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position the Director, Compliance Operations of NSW Department of Primary Industries.

Director, Compliance Standards means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position the Director, Compliance Standards of NSW Department of Primary Industries.

Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area means a part of New South Wales declared as a restricted area under this Proclamation (P191) for the control of Queensland fruit fly.

PFA means that part of another State or Territory declared as a Pest Free Area for the control of Queensland fruit fly.

Queensland fruit fly means the pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt)

Queensland fruit fly host material means any Queensland fruit fly host produce or used packaging.

Queensland fruit fly host produce means any fruit, plant or vegetable listed in Schedule 1.

Used packaging means any packaging that has contained Queensland fruit fly host produce.

SCHEDULE 2

Greater Sunraysia (NSW Portion) Pest Free Area

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the Murray River and the western boundary of the Parish of Wentworth, County of Wentworth, then in a generally northerly direction by the Parish of Wentworth boundary to its intersection with the Silver City Highway, then in a north westerly direction along the Silver City Highway to the intersection of the Silver City Highway and High Darling Road, then in a north easterly direction along High Darling Road to the intersection of High Darling Road and Polia Road, then in northerly direction along Polia Road to grid line 070 (grid reference 366070, Cuthero), then in a straight line in an easterly direction to Pooncarie - Menindee Road (grid reference 465070 Pooncarie), then in a south easterly direction along Pooncarie - Menindee Road, which becomes Tarcoola Street, which becomes Wentworth - Pooncarie Road, then in a generally south westerly direction along Wentworth - Pooncarie Road to the intersection of Wentworth - Pooncarie Road and an unnamed road (grid reference 943518, Para), then in a south westerly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 204207, Mildura East), then in a south westerly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 174111, Mildura East), then in a south easterly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection of the unnamed road and the Sturt Highway (grid reference 230035, Karadoc), then in a south easterly direction along the Sturt Highway to the intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 537763, Robinvale), then in a northerly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 547778, Robinvale), then in a generally easterly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with Leslie Drive (grid reference 604767, Robinvale), then in an easterly direction along Leslie Drive

to an intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 620766, Robinvale), then along the unnamed road to an intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 627765, Robinvale), then in a south easterly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with the Sturt Highway (grid reference 631760, Robinvale), then in a generally easterly direction along the Sturt Highway to an intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 988714, Waldaira Lake), then in a southerly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 983675, Waldaira Lake), then in a generally south easterly direction along the unnamed road to the intersection with an unnamed road (grid reference 040600, Waldaira Lake), then in a straight line in a south easterly direction to the intersection of Weimby - Benongal Road and Weimby Road (grid reference 084536, Waldaira Lake), then in a south easterly direction along Weimby Road, which becomes Weimby - Kyalite Road, to the intersection of Weimby - Kyalite Road and an unnamed road (grid reference 256383, Windomal), then in a straight line in a southerly direction to Wakool River (grid reference 256348, Windomal), then in a south easterly direction along Wakool River to the intersection of Wakool River and Moulamein Road, then in a generally easterly direction along Moulamein Road, to the intersection with the Moulamein Barham Road, then in a generally south westerly direction along the Moulamein Barham Road to its intersection with the northern boundary of the Parish of Barham, County of Wakool, then in a generally south easterly direction along the eastern boundary of the Parish of Barham to its intersection with the Murray River, then in a generally north westerly direction along the Murray River to the point of commencement.
