URGENT FOR ALL VETERINARIANS

Suspect Equine Influenza Cases in the Purple Zone

The Equine Influenza (EI) control program has reached a stage where it is once again vital to use laboratory testing to confirm suspect cases of EI in the Purple Zone. Horse owners in the purple zone who suspect a horse has EI are once more being directed to ring the Emergency Animal Disease Hotline on 1800 675 888. The Hotline operator will transfer the call to a veterinarian at the Local Disease Control Centre (LDCC), Menangle.

The LDCC veterinarian will assess the case and if appropriate, task a veterinary practitioner to investigate it, and give the practitioner a Task Request Number. Practitioners who are asked directly by their clients to examine a horse that might have EI should first phone the Hotline to get a Task Request Number. NSW DPI will not pay for investigations that it has not tasked.

Investigation by practitioners involves clinical examination, sample collection, and completion of Anemis 1 and Anemis 2/3 forms, and a Specimen Advice form. The Anemis forms are at the NSW DPI website: go to www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/ and follow the links to Equine Influenza, Information for Veterinarians. The Specimen Advice form is at www.agric.nsw.gov.au/reader/6531. The forms and the samples must be despatched as soon as possible (but without risking delay in transit) to the Regional Veterinary Laboratory at Menangle.

It is essential that a full history is recorded. Particular attention should be paid to:

- Has any person who lives on the property, works on the property or visited the property had contact with other horses e.g. a racetrack, stables, riding school etc?
- Have any horse transport vehicles, or feed supply vehicles visited, or been moved onto the property?
- Has any equipment been in contact with horses at another property?
- Have any horses on the property been previously tested?
