There can be only one nominated fisher for a fishing business at any given time. A person can be nominated to hold the same endorsement for two or more fishing businesses. A nomination does not take effect until NSW Department of Primary Industries approves this nomination form and the nominated fisher is in possession of the fishing business card or digital authority. Fishing business owners are responsible for ensuring that NSW Department of Primary Industries has approved the nomination form before the nominated fisher starts working. Once a nomination is made it must remain in effect for a **minimum of 48 hours**. In order to take fish for sale, the nominated fisher must also be in physical possession of their current Class 1 commercial fishing licence. Nominating a new fisher automatically revokes a previous nomination.
