



Biosecurity (Abalone Viral Ganglioneuritis) Control Order (No. 3) 2021

Trade of interstate live abalone resumes in NSW under specified conditions.

On 8 June NSW Department of Primary Industries published the Biosecurity (Abalone viral ganglioneuritis) Control Order (No.3) 2021 that supports the resumption of movement into NSW of live abalone from Eastern Zone Victoria, Tasmanian land-based abalone farms and all other Australian jurisdictions abalone. Restrictions continue to apply to Tasmanian and Victorian western and central zone wild caught abalone, and Victorian farmed abalone.

Movements of live abalone into NSW are now allowed under specified conditions from Tasmanian land-based abalone farms and the Victorian eastern abalone zone wild harvest fishery.

Any abalone imported into NSW **must not** have come into contact with:

1. wild caught Tasmanian, Victorian central or western zone abalone, or
2. Victorian aquaculture abalone, or
3. associated holding water or fittings.

Fittings used in connection with live abalone from wild Tasmanian, Victorian central or western zone, or Victorian aquaculture abalone must not be moved into NSW unless it has been appropriately cleaned and disinfected.

All abalone waste water moved into NSW that has been in contact with live abalone from outside the NSW wild abalone fishery or Victorian eastern zone abalone fishery must be disposed of directly to the sewer.

A Record of Movement (Abalone) form must be completed for all movements of Tasmanian farmed abalone into NSW.
