



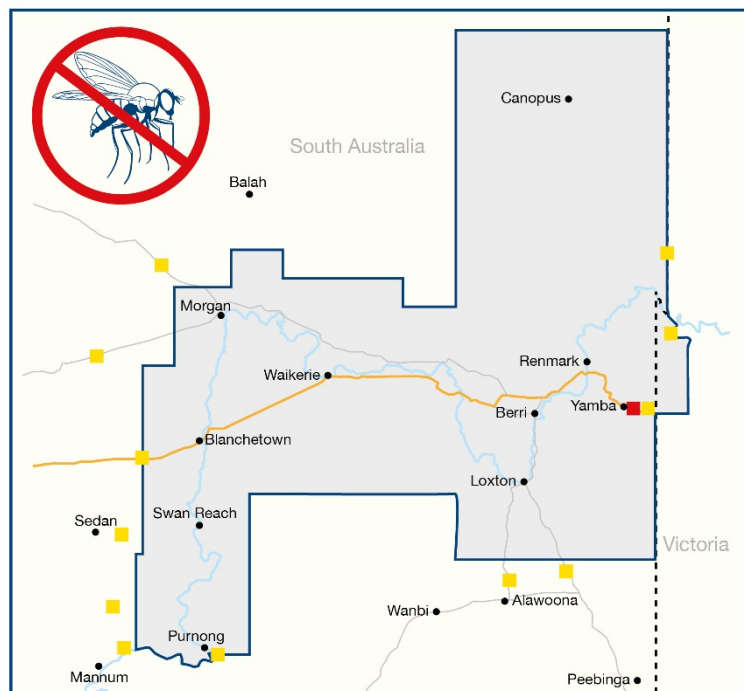
Industry Advice – Upcoming changes to Import Conditions into the Riverland Pest Free Area

The South Australian government has advised of changes to import conditions for consignments of fruit fly host produce into the **Riverland Pest Free Area (PFA) only**.

From **29 July 2021** NSW growers and distributors of fruit fly host produce must ensure that an approved treatment is applied to produce before it is sent directly to the Riverland PFA.

Movement requirements of produce into all **other areas** of South Australia are **not affected** by these amendments.

Reconsigning and repackaging

Businesses accredited under the ICAs below **MUST NOT** reassign or repackage produce for direct movement into the Riverland PFA if the produce does not meet the certification requirements stated above.

ICA-17	Reconsigning whole or split consignments and transporting of certified produce
ICA-57	Repacking of certified fruit fly and melon thrips host produce
