1. Chair's introduction

The Chair welcomed members to the meeting.

2. Confirmation of outcomes from previous meeting

The draft outcomes of the 47th RFSTEC meeting were accepted as a true and accurate record of the meeting (Moved John Paton, Seconded Lionel Jones, Carried).

3. Action items from previous meeting

The Committee noted the progress on action items from the previous meeting (Table 1).

4. Gone Fishing Day 2016 update

DPI provided an update to the committee on the outcomes of the successful Gone Fishing Day event on 16 October 2016. Major outcomes are summarised below:

6 major events snapshot

- Highly accessible locations chosen in the middle of town/city at Botany Bay, Port Macquarie, Lake Illawarra, Dubbo, Wagga and Newcastle to promote attendance
- Wide range of fun fishing activities to create a festival type atmosphere which could occupy a family for a couple of hours with activities for new entrants to the sport but also experienced fishers
- Many partnerships with various organisations to promote lots of different activities
- Over 15,000 people estimated to have attended the 6 locations.
- No recreational fishing licence required in NSW on Gone Fishing Day.
- Over 50 Fishcare Volunteers involved on the Day.
- Most popular activities were fishing workshops (over subscribed), cooking & filleting demonstration, fishing expert talks, giveaways (goodie bags), compliance boat stands, casting comp, touch tank and fishing tips area.

Club events snapshot

- 37 grants (up to \$2,000) provided from the Recreational Fishing Trusts to fishing clubs and organisations to run community fishing events and activities on Gone Fishing day.
- The size of events varied with an average of 110 people per club event.
- Most clubs held fishing workshops, barbecues, casting demonstrations, prize giveaways etc.
- More lead in time required for clubs to get involved noting limiting resource capacity and experience of some clubs.

More flexibility with grants to be considered next year for fishing club events (multiple days, flexible dates).

5. Recreational Fishing Trust update

The status of the Saltwater Trust was presented. There have been no new expenditure or changes to the budget since the last meeting.

6. Review of new Saltwater Trust grant application

Four new funding applications were received and reviewed by RFSTEC. Expenditure recommendations are provided in Table 3 and 4. Funding recommendations with respect to each project will be forwarded to the Recreational Fishing NSW Advisory Council for consideration.

7. Fishing and diving museum and resource centre for NSW – Mr Melven Brown

Mr Melven Brown provided a presentation on a proposal to establish a fishing and diving museum in NSW. RFSTEC members provided in principle support for a museum but noted that the Recreational Fishing Trusts could only provide monetary assistance should a formal grant application be submitted. The committee recommended that a letter be sent to the Recreational Fishing NSW Advisory Council expressing in principle support of this potential initiative.

8. Review of new Saltwater Trust habitat grant applications

Recommendations for funding from the Habitat Action Grants Technical Panel (TAP) were presented to RFSTEC members. Projects recommended for funding are listed in Table 5. Projects not recommended for funding are listed in Table 6.

RFSTEC supported the recommendations made by the TAP.

Fish at Hawkesbury farm project returned \$5000 of unspent funds. The committee supported the inclusion of this money to the Habitat Action Grants 2016-17 budget.
