

## Download FisherMobile to Your iPhone

This user guide will help you set up FisherMobile as an application shortcut icon added to your iPhone Home Screen.

### Before You Start

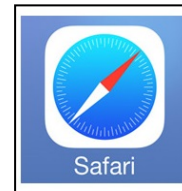
You will require:

### Step By Step Instructions with Device Screenshots

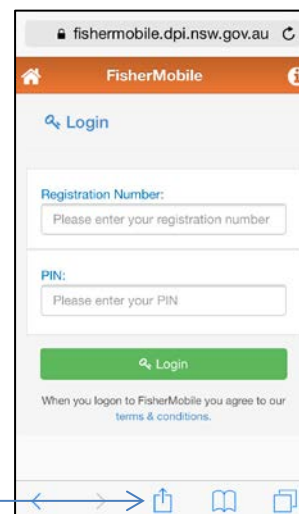
#### Step 1 – Locate FisherMobile

- Launch Safari on your iPhone and navigate to the DPI NSW website for FishOnline, containing the FisherMobile icon as displayed on the right.
- Tap the icon and this will launch the web page you want to 'pin' to your home screen.
- Alternatively you may [Download FisherMobile](#) by clicking this link



#### Step 2 – Load FisherMobile

- The FisherMobile Login Screen will load on the browser.

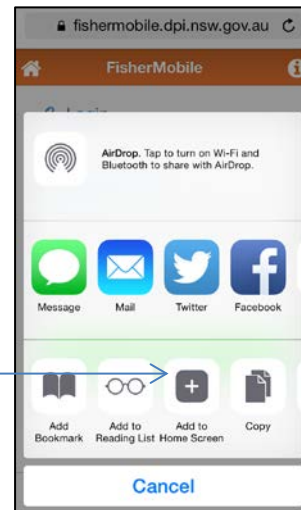


#### Step 3 – Add to Home Screen

- Tap the icon at the bottom of screen. This will open a new window.

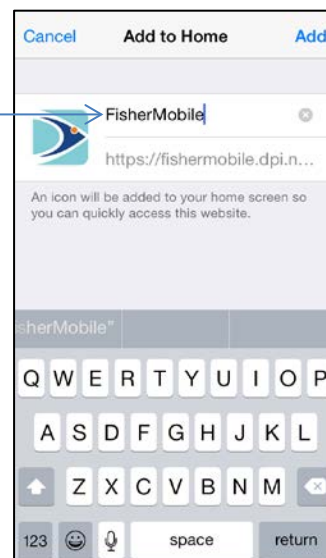
### Step 3 Con. – Add to Home Screen

- Tap the 'Add to Home Screen' icon



### Step 4 – Add to Home Screen

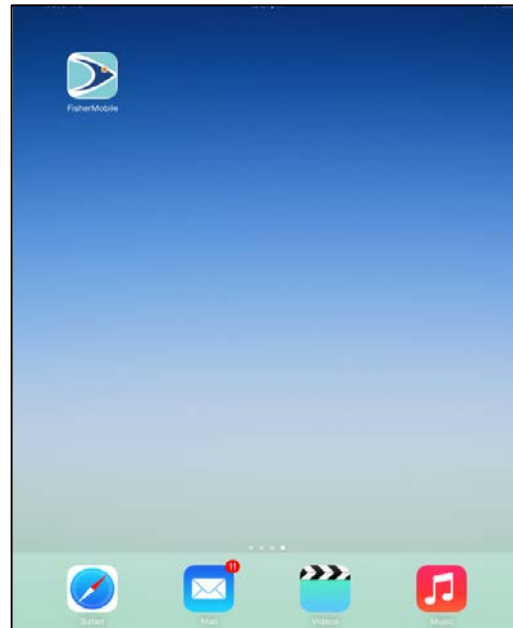
- You may then enter a name for the Shortcut. We recommend using "FisherMobile".
- Tap 'Add' and the FisherMobile icon will then be added to your home screen.

## Step 5 – Check Your Home Screen

- The icon will appear on your home screen like any other App shortcut or widget.
- You can position the icon on your Home Screen anywhere you like
- Tapping the icon loads the website as a 'Web App'.
