Governments need to report truthfully to industry. We have seen some government bodies not reveal the full extent of a RFA failure, thus industry cannot

defend itself properly or cant address issues if its not told. Offer industry a 10 year extension rather than 5 because 5 years is not enough to encourage business to invest into the future. Also something needs to be put in
