f) **Mandatory requirements for movement of cattle tick carrier in NSW** [Select appropriate option]

Cattle moving into NSW from a feedlot in Queensland in a cattle tick infested area or restricted property to an abattoir or feedlot

- The feedlot in Queensland has a Cattle Tick Risk Management Plan in place.
- The cattle tick carrier was held at the feedlot for 35 continuous days immediately before importation.
- The cattle tick carrier underwent a visual inspection for cattle tick by the person in charge and it was found free of cattle tick.
- If the vehicle on which the cattle tick carrier is transported transits through an infested area before it enters the State:
 - the cattle tick carrier was not off-loaded from the vehicle, and
 - no additional cattle tick carriers were loaded into the vehicle, unless the person has complied with the conditions for importation of the cattle tick carrier set out in Division 2 Subdivision 1 of the Biosecurity Order (Permitted Activities) 2019.

Cattle moving from a cattle tick infested area or restricted property to an abattoir or feedlot in NSW that does not have a Cattle Tick Risk Management Plan in place.

- A biosecurity certifier has issued a Carrier Biosecurity Certificate that certifies the cattle tick carrier underwent a manual inspection (no earlier than 24 hours before importation) and was found free of cattle ticks OR a visual examination for cattle tick followed by a supervised chemical treatment.
- The cattle tick carrier must enter NSW within 96 hours if treated with an acaricide, OR if treated with Endectocide the cattle tick carrier must enter NSW in the period starting 4 days and ending 7 days after the risk minimisation requirements for this treatment were met.
- If the vehicle on which the cattle tick carrier is transported transits through an infested area before it enters the State:
 - the cattle tick carrier was not off-loaded from the vehicle, and
 - no additional cattle tick carriers were loaded into the vehicle, unless the person has complied with the conditions for importation of the cattle tick carrier set out in Division 2 Subdivision 1 of the Biosecurity Order (Permitted Activities) 2019.
