This timeframe ends when we send your details to a contractor who prints the licence. We cannot give you a timeframe for when you will receive your licence in the post.

Privacy statement

The provision of this information is required for the purpose of processing your request under the *Game and Feral Animal Control Act 2002*. If you choose not to provide the requested information, the Department of Regional NSW may not be able to process your request.
