Section E: Special requirements for visitors

- If you intend to use a firearm to hunt game and feral animals in NSW, you **must** contact the NSW Police Force Firearms Registry for an [Overseas Visitors Safari Tour/Hunting Permit](#) **before** you submit this application with the NSW Department of Primary Industries. To qualify for this permit, you must hunt in a specified organised safari and with a guide who has been granted a [Safari Tour Permit](#), also issued by the NSW Police Force Firearms Registry.
- Please contact the NSW Police Force Firearms Registry on **+61 2 6670 8590** before you submit this application.
- Your guide must hold either a NSW Restricted or General Game Hunting Licence that is either a Standard or a Guide Licence, and you must be **accompanied by your guide at all times** when hunting in NSW.
- A NSW General (Visitor's) Game Hunting Licence authorises you to hunt game animals on private land in NSW with permission. It does not authorise you to hunt on declared public land.
- A NSW Visitor's Game Hunting Licence does not supersede, override, or preclude you from the requirements of other hunting, firearm, safety, and animal welfare laws and regulations currently in place in NSW.
