TO AVOID misunderstandings with your neighbours and to reduce complaints, it can be helpful to advise neighbours about activities that may affect them.

Your neighbours may not have a farming background and therefore may not understand what you are doing or why. By informing them of your plans and how long the activity is likely to take, you will reduce the likelihood that they will make a complaint.
