

# SUDDEN OAK DEATH

## About:

Sudden oak death (*Phytophthora ramorum*) is an exotic pest not present in Australia, but is listed in the top 42 exotic pests that threaten Australia's forestry, nut and nursery industries, amenity trees and the native environment

## Key signs to look out for:

- ✓ Red-black ooze from trunk or branches
- ✓ Sunken discoloured lesion
- ✓ Stained cambium under bark
- ✓ Tree unhealthy or dead

## Key hosts:

-  Oak (*Quercus*)
-  Larch (*Larix*)
-  Magnolia
-  Maple (*Acer*)
-  Avocado (*Persea*)
-  Pittosporum
